Thankyou also to Sujatha Varkey and Samanth Fielding for their service to the Parish.

In the last few months, I have been out and about marking pavements to try and remind dog walkers to pick up after their dogs and keep our streets clean. If you see me, I am happy to chat about any parish issues.



D-Day 80 Event - 6th June 2024 - Village Hall 7.15pm

"The bravery and sacrifice of those people in securing the peace and freedom we enjoy today will be observed by the lighting of beacons around the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories. Laughton-en-le-Morthen Parish Council is holding an event to mark the 80th anniversary of D-Day and to take part in the beacon lighting taking place across the country. A gas beacon, especially designed for this event, has been purchased and will be lit on the field at the back of the hall at 9.15 pm, accompanied by a short speech to mark the occasion. The last post will be played. The event starts at 7.15 pm, with pie and peas being available from 7.30 pm. We do need to know numbers for catering so please request your tickets as soon as possible by contacting Janice Cutting 07582827158 – the tickets are £4.00. Entry is free if you do not want pie and peas. The Parish Council has booked Maltby Miners Welfare Band for the occasion, and they will be playing from 7.45pm until the beacon lighting, with a short intermission. There will be stalls at the village hall, a raffle, a prize for the best 40's outfit and a selection of cakes and tea or coffee to purchase. Funds raised from the event will be put towards further improvements to the Village Hall. We hope you will join us for this event.

Defibrillator Training Session

Thank you to all that attended the defibrillator sessions organised by Laughton-en-le-Morthen Parish Council earlier this year. These were very well attended and most informative.

The lady who presented the session recommended that attendees watch this video as a reminder: Everything you need to know about life-saving defibrillators (youtube.com)

The acronym "ABC" in the context of CPR and first aid stands for:

Airway, Breathing, and Circulation.

These are the three critical components to check when performing life-saving procedures:

- · A for Airway: Ensure that the person's airway is clear. If the airway is blocked, it can prevent breathing and should be addressed immediately.
- · B for Breathing: Check if the person is breathing normally. If not, rescue breaths may be needed to maintain
- C for Circulation: Assess whether the person has a pulse and if blood is circulating. If there is no pulse, chest compressions are necessary to restore circulation.

Remember, in an emergency, these steps can help stabilise a person until professional medical help arrives. Always call for emergency services if you encounter someone who needs CPR.

The Parish Council has provided 5 defibrillators in this Parish. Your precept helped to fund these and to provide for replacements parts and batteries. A new Defibsafe box has just been purchased and installed in Brookhouse. Please take a few minutes to walk around the Parish to identify where your defibrillators are located:

- · On the external wall of the Village Hall in Laughton-en-le-Morthen.
- On the external wall of Laughton [&I School on School Road, Laughton-en-le-Morthen.
- · On the external wall of Laughton All Saints' C of E Primary School on High Street, Laughton-en-le-Morthen
- On the external wall of the Traveller's Rest, Main Street, Brookhouse.
- On the wall driving through Carr, Carr Lane, Carr.

REMEMBER - In an emergency dial 999. The operator will tell you where the nearest device is located that is not in use, and the code to access it. They will also talk you through the CPR and how to use the device.





Litter Picking Award

The Parish Council would like to thank those parishioners that can be seen out and about helping to keep our parish clean and tidy.

At the May Annual Parish Meeting, the Chairman, Trevor Stanway, invited along one of our younger parishioners to receive a special certificate for her services to the Parish. Miss Seren Bounds was awarded a certificate for her hard work in keeping our Parish Tidy. Seren can often be seen around Laughton picking litter with her litter picker and Hi-Viz vest which she requested as a Christmas present. The chairman awarded her a certificate and sweets in recognition for her contribution.

Hanging Baskets

As you will be aware from our last issue Parish Council has taken the decision to place hanging baskets in the centre of the village for summer 2024. They will go up in June and stay up until the end of October.

Since the last newsletter we have received a positive response from parishioners prepared to sponsor some of the baskets which, with the ones that Parish Council has funded, has made it possible for the baskets to be hung from the top of High Street down to the bottom of St John's Road. Please bear in mind that RMBC will not allow baskets to go on lamp posts which already have highway signs on them. We also avoided ones where the hedge makes it impossible to fix them.

Some parishioners have asked for plaques, other have not. We are most grateful for those that have decided to sponsor a basket – you know who you are!



Speeding & Road Safety

Ward Councillor Sophie Dack recently attended the Parish Council meeting to summarise the survey results regarding speeding and parking issues in the village. The results are not a surprise in that there is much concern about speeding and particularly issues with parking. What is less consistent is the solutions that people would like to see introduced that they think would be most effective. There was a majority of parishioners in favour of speed bumps, though it was not a landslide, and a number of people did not want them.

Laughton will get its first speed activated road sign within the next four weeks. This will be located initially as High Street meets St Johns Road, but can be relocated to other areas of the Parish. This is a welcome introduction.

Other solutions are still under discussion, and we will let you know as this develops.

Brookhouse Footpath

Recent notices placed at either end of a much used 'footpath' have raised a number of queries to see what is happening. The issue as to whether this footpath should have been on the definitive footpath list has been an ongoing matter for some time. Many Parishioners and the Parish Council have provided evidence regarding is use, both now and historically. RMBC have now made the decision to make a Definitive Map Modification Order asserting that both stretches of path should be public footpath.

Our understanding of the next stage of the process is as follows: the Order will be drafted and then will be advertised to a list of statutory consultees and notices placed on site. If RMBC do not receive any objections, or objections that are subsequently withdrawn, RMBC can confirm the Order and will then speak to landowners to arrange opening the route up and signing it. The route will then be protected as any right of way.

If RMBC get any objections to the Order that cannot be resolved, the matter will pass onto the Planning Inspectorate who may decide to convene a public inquiry to decide the future of the route. As the legal process is not completed and reached a final outcome yet, the route is not a public right of way currently, which is why RMBC have placed signs at either end of the routes.

St John's Road Allotments

St Johns Road Allotments are once again a hive of activity, preparations are well underway for the growing season. The popularity of the allotment remains high, and we are almost at full capacity, however we do have a few plots currently available so if you are interested please contact the clerk or complete an application available on the Parish Council website at: St John's Road Allotments - Laughton-en-le-Morthen Parish Council (laughtonparishcouncil.gov.uk)

We have recently developed two communal bays where allotment tenants have access to free manure and wood chippings. Work is scheduled to begin on the communal area: -

Stage 1 - To create raised beds

Stage 2 - To create a seating area

Stage 3 - To erect a Polytunnel

If you have a few hours to spare and would be happy to help with this project you will receive a warm welcome. Last year we held a Scarecrow Festival / Fun day at the Village Hall to showcase the allotment, it was amazing and proved so popular and well attended that we plan to repeat the event later in the year, a date will be announced shortly.
