If you have walked past the Village Hall recently you will see that it is a hive of activity with the new extension now built. Work is well underway to renovate the toilets, and, in a few weeks, the new kitchen will be installed.

The project, which is being funded by a £100,000 grant from FCC Communities Foundation, will provide a new commercial kitchen and a much needed modern, hygienic toilet block, ready to use at the start of 2023. Trevor Stanway, Chairman of Laughton-enle-Morthen Parish Council is excited that the project is starting to take shape. He says: "It's great to see our vision for this vital community facility moving closer to reality. We are extremely grateful for the funding FCC Communities Foundation has given us and we're looking forward to opening to the public." FCC Communities Foundation is a not-for-profit business that awards grants for community projects through the Landfill Communities Fund. Penny Horne, spokesperson for FCC Communities Foundation, says: "It's always nice to see something we have funded start to take shape. We're delighted to be supporting such a worthwhile project and look forward to it benefitting lots of different people within the area."

Life with Guests from Ukraine



What is life like having guests from Ukraine? When the war broke out in Ukraine it was non debateable, we had 2 spare rooms and beds, end of conversation.

Very soon we were put in touch with a family needing our support. They arrived with us on 2nd May 2022, and have now been with us for 6 months. We have also been lucky enough to meet other families from Ukraine who are living in the village, our extended family just keeps extending.

We have managed to overcome the language barriers with the help of 'Google' and 'Say Hi'. They have learnt English, while my Ukraine remains at two words.

Day to day life nearly always brings something interesting, with calls of "Janice.. I need your help" or "Janice, something interesting" or "Janice, why butterfly when butter does not fly" or some other interesting piece of logic. I know when there is homework to be done when the computer is put on my knee, ready to be logged into the school homework system. I can arrive home, and enough food has been cooked for the next three days, or a lovely cake is sitting waiting to be tried. My pantry and fridges bulge at the sides, my saucepans are in constant use, but the house is alive, the dog is thriving, she loves our Ukrainian guests and particularly Ukrainian food!

The initial few weeks were difficult because of all the admin that was needed. We needed to learn about each other as well as our cultural differences, which are really interesting.

We have had lots of help from the village residents for which I will always be grateful. It has seemed that I have only had to ask for help and it has been provided: school uniform, bikes, cricket gear, football tickets, we live in a wonderful community.

My guests have been with us now for 6 months, do I regret one moment of hosting my new family – no, not at all!

Both are a delight to have around the house. Mum helps with the cleaning and cooking; she makes the most delicious cakes. We take it in turns with the shopping, meals are often taken together, but we have a mutual respect for each other's culture. We tend to have set mealtimes, whereas our guests eat when they are hungry.

The young man helps with outside work such as sweeping the yard and driveway, helping cut the grass, stack wood and washing my car (for his pocket money).

Being a host family is not for everyone but I think that by taking things slowly, respecting each other and not getting upset over the little things, it works really well. Yes, the fridge will be overtaken with food, meals will be stored in the saucepan, food we keep in the fridge will be left out, items will appear that you've never seen before and would not even want to try. However, it doesn't take much to adapt and find your way around dealing with some of this. With patience and understanding the rewards are tenfold. We have extended family for life now, and I know there will always be a welcome in Ukraine for us once life returns to normal. More host families are needed. For anyone looking to become a host family and would like to know more, I'm always available to have a chat.

Lest We Forget



Over the past few years, the Parish Council has displayed large poppies on the lampposts in the villages of Laughton-en-le-Morthen, Brookhouse, Slade Hooton, Carr and Newhall.

These poppies have the names of the soldiers who had made the supreme sacrifice for their country in either the 1st or 2nd World War, as listed on our War Memorial.

In 2021, while adding the poppies to the lampposts, a number of residents asked if the men named were from that part of the Parish and suggested that it would be good if this was to happen in future so that the Poppy with that soldier's name on was close to their old home.

Trudy Hutson, our Vice Chair, decided to research where the men lived prior to the wars.

Research had been completed previously by Jon D Harvey on the men who died in the 2nd World War and in most cases, he had recorded which village the men lived. However, a number of men did not have their residence recorded. (This resource resides in All Saints Church in a blue folder.)

Trudy researched the men named on the memorial though WW1 death records, pensions, valuables and the 1911 census. She also used the 1911 & 1939 census to locate residence, where Jon D Harvey had omitted it in his original research, in an attempt to locate the remaining men from the 2nd World War.

A number of men who died in the 1st world war remain undetectable as only their initials are on the memorial. Hundreds if not thousands of men died with the surnames of Fox, West, Taylor and Young and without further information she has been unable to locate all the men who died in the 1st World War.

The research found that in 1923, when the Laughton-enle-Morthen memorial was erected, many of the men commemorated on the war memorial lived in Laughton Common, Thurcroft and other surrounding hamlets. Thurcroft did not have a memorial until August 1925 in the Miners welfare.

17 of the name poppies have been placed on or near to the roads where the men lived in the Parish.

Community Defibrillators

Just a reminder that Laughton-en-le-Morthen Parish Council own and maintain four defibrillators in the parish. These are located:

On the external wall of the Village Hall in Laughton-en-le-Morthen.



On the external wall of Laughton J&I School on School Road, Laughton-en-le-Morthen.

On the external wall of Laughton All Saints C of E Primary School on High Street, Laughton-en-le-Morthen.



On the external wall of the Traveller's Rest⁷¹¹ Main Street, Brookhouse.

The devices are designed to be used without any requirement for training. When receiving a 999 call Yorkshire Ambulance Service

will assess the patient's condition and may give out the access code to the Defibrillator Cabinet if appropriate.

The machine itself gives spoken instructions and decides if a shock is required.
