## D-Day 80 - 6th June 2024

"The 6th June 2024 marks the 80th anniversary of D-Day, when Allied forces mounted the largest amphibious invasion the world has ever witnessed.

In 1944 Operation Overlord saw around 4,000 ships and landing craft set down about 132,500 troops on five Normandy beaches in an action that would bring about the liberation of north-west Europe from Nazi occupation.

The bravery and sacrifice of those people in securing the peace and freedom we enjoy today will be observed by the lighting of beacons around the United Kingdom, Channel Islands, Isle of Man and UK Overseas Territories. I hope your community will join us. We are asking villages, towns, cities and organisations of all sizes to mark the 80th anniversary of D-Day by lighting a beacon at 9.15 pm on 6th June 2024, in celebration of the 'light of peace' that emerged out of the darkness of war."

### Speeding and Parking Issues

Members of the public recently attended the monthly parish council meeting to contribute their views to one of our planned agenda items to discuss current parking and speeding issues in the village. Ward Councillors also kindly accepted our invitation to attend. This is the current update.

#### School Parking

This has been raised many times by the Parish Council and Parishioners. The solution is simple but difficult to enforce, more parents need to walk to school with their children. For those that choose to drive and park it should be a limited 5-minute stop in order to keep the area clear of traffic and the zig-zag lines should be respected. Staff trying to enforce this are often ignored.

#### Actions from the meeting

This newsletter is an appeal to parents to walk from home or from the village hall car park, where there is plentiful parking, 5 minute's walk away. Ward Councillors are to speak to the headteacher regarding staggered finish times - this will only work if parents do not turn up early and spend 20 whilst minutes waiting on their phones. Enforcement patrols are to be requested by Ward Councillors to fine parents illegally parked. Nobody wants to see a child harmed because they could not be seen.

## Hanging Baskets

The Parish Council has taken the decision to place hanging baskets in the centre of the village for Summer 2024. They will go up in June and stay up until end of October.

Practically, for most impact, it would appear sensible to focus on those lamp posts from the crossroads up to the church. Dependant on cost and support this could stretch down towards St John's Road.

Parishioners have contacted the Parish Council about schemes that they have seen in other Parishes, where local residents sponsor a hanging basket in order to decorate the village. This would enable more baskets to be ordered.

The cost of a basket is expected to be around  $\pounds 45.00$ . If you would like to sponsor a basket and have your name, or the name of a loved one placed on it, please contact the Parish Clerk before 31st March 2024 when our order for baskets will be placed.

#### **Speeding and Road Safety**

Ward Councillors had already held a session on this issue prior to the Parish Council Meeting. Their feedback was that opinion in the village is quite divided on what is needed, e.g., speed humps, 20mph zones, traffic lights.

They do have access to some funding next year and want to spend this as effectively as possible. As such they are currently working to put together a consultation on this issue and more details will be forthcoming in the New Year in terms of what this will look like.

In the interim data sources are being requested to understand the speed hot spots more accurately.

Ward Councillors are also keen to do as many community speed watch sessions as possible and parishioners are invited to take part in these. Please contact Councillor Julia Hall cllrjulia.hall@rotherham.gov.uk
